

Questions for Galatians 3

1. What is the apostle saying about the Galatian believers by calling them “foolish” in verses 1 and 3?
2. Can you paraphrase the five questions that Paul puts to the Galatian believers in verses 1-5?
3. How would you state the primary theses of Galatians 3 from verses 6-7 and 26-29?
4. How do verses 6-8 demonstrate that those who believe are the children of Abraham?
5. What is the source of the curse, and how are we freed from it? See verses 10-14
6. Why is it impossible to be saved by works of the law? See verses 2-3, 11-12
7. To whom is the promise made? See verse 16
8. What purpose does the law serve? See verses 22-25
9. What does it mean to be justified? See verse 6, I Cor. 1:30, II Cor. 5:21, and Phil. 3:9
10. What are the promise and the covenant? See verses 14-19, Gen. 12:3, 7, Ex. 19:4-6, I Peter 2:9-11, Psalm 89:3-5
11. Can you show from Galatians 3 that:
 - a. Christ is the head of the covenant?
 - b. the covenant is governed by election?
 - c. The works of faith are the fruit of faith?
 - d. Works cannot be a pre-requisite to salvation?
 - e. A believer cannot lose his salvation by failing to produce the works of faith?
 - f. The promise is a sovereign declaration of God, not a conditional offer?
